HOW DOES IT WORK?

A DCPS teacher commits to learning structured literacy and working with a student




Teacher is paired with a mentor and a K-2 student in August 2019

Teacher attends orientation and 10 weekly graduatelevel courses, taught at the DCRC Teacher meets 2 x a
week after school
with student,
receiving lesson
planning help and
feedback from mentor

After 12 weeks, teacher receives certificate and compensation, and is eligible to take the Center for Effective Reading Instruction (CERI) test
